

Logica Armchair Treasure Hunt

Where could it be?

On December 17th I will conceal a small box with an I on its lid. Your task is to find it. Clues to its precise location can be found in the pages that follow.

What do I do?

Take the initial letter of the significant word of each answer, with names take the first letter of the surname unless it makes more sense to use the personal name. With double answers choose the letter that works better.

It's no secret that these will spell out answers to questions. If they don't fit then you should try to find 'my' answer, or you could be on the right track.

Signs might help point you in the right direction, but it can't be that easy—the information you want may be missing. On the other hand you might like to consider where Blair cited Major as a political example. But when decoding ignore accidental signs.

How do I enter?

There is no official entry form, just write out your solutions legibly—it is not necessary to provide reasons for your answers although if we disagree then without explanations I can do nothing more than mark you wrong. And don't forget your football goals.

Bonus marks will be awarded for giving connections with the central theme, cracking relevant codes, the name of the treasure village and for finding the box itself.

What are the rewards?

A prize of £60 will be awarded to the first finder of the box. £60 for the highest score, £40 for the second score, £30 for the third score and £10 for the entrant scoring the lowest score of at least 300 points. No team can win more than one prize and each must have a Logica 'captain'.

The scoring scheme reflects the degree of difficulty of each question.

What if I find it?

If you locate the treasure box then please use discretion while unearthing it, read the instructions inside and conceal the box as you found it.

If you are sure you have found the right place and there is nothing there then please try to contact me as soon as possible as the box may have been disturbed.

When does it end?

If no-one has found the treasure then extra clues will be issued to entrants only, please keep a copy of the original questions and your answers. A full set of answers will be issued to all entrants.
